Attorney General on 04.11.2009 re the appeal preferred to the Supreme Court against the judgment in CA(Writ)1413/2005. This meeting is reported to have been attended by my predecessor Mr. Jayatilleka, Mr. Jazeel- Additional Director General of Customs (Enforcement) and two Assistant Superintendents of Customs. Mr. P. Dep-Solicitor General and Mr. Rajaratnam-Deputy Solicitor General are reported to have been present at this meeting.

It is also been reported that this Department should continue with the Customs Inquiry under Sec. 8(1) of the Customs Ordinance and in the event any objection is raised by the petitioner Colombo Dockyard Ltd, citing the Court of Appeal judgment, then the Hon. Attorney General will defend the right to proceed with the inquiry.

However, the aforesaid letter does not reflect the advice given to my predecessor at the meeting referred to above.

Considering the colossal amount of fiscal levies evaded by Colombo Dockyard Ltd in respect of vessels sold locally about ten years ago, I am of the view that the withdrawal of the appeal to the Supreme Court at this stage is not appropriate.
